Germany: at the heart of Europe

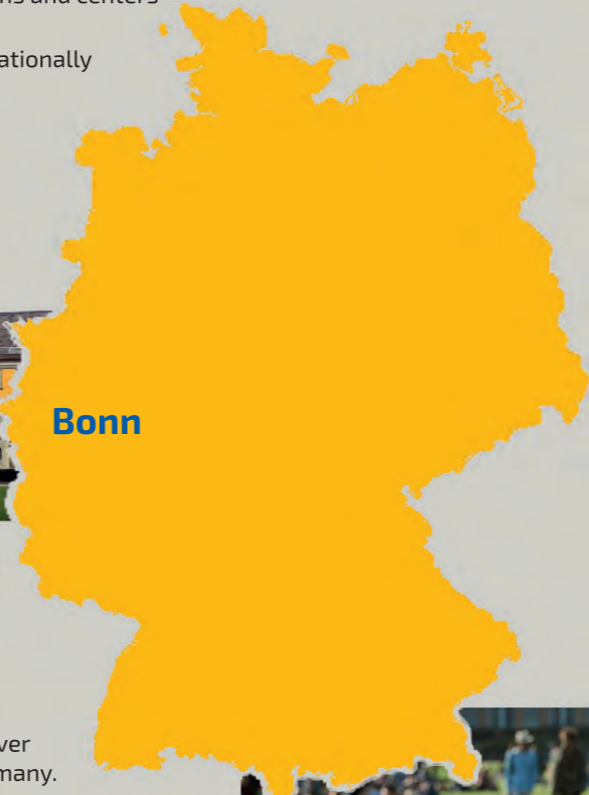

Admission requirements

A 4-year (240 ECTS) B.A. or equivalent degree acquired in Germany or abroad in Archaeologies, Asian or Islamic Art History, Comparative Religious Studies, Egyptology, English Studies, German Studies, History, History of the Islamicate World, History of Law, Japanese Studies, Korean Studies, Latin American Studies, Slavic Studies, Social Sciences, South East Asian Studies, Theologies, Tibetan Studies, or similar disciplines.

Minimum Grade: 2,5

Language requirements

- ▶ C1 proficiency in English (documented by, e.g., a B.A. program taught entirely in English, minimum scores of TOEFL iBT 94/IELTS 7.0)
- ▶ German language proficiency is not required.
- ▶ Proficiency in source languages is recommended.

Costs

- ▶ "university fee" (~600 € p.a.)
- ▶ living expenses

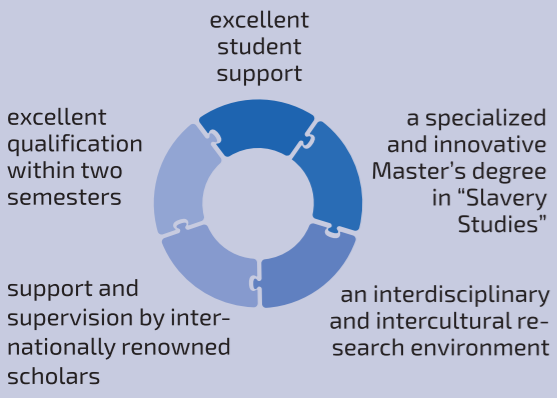

We aim at researching different types of slavery and slavery-like phenomena and go beyond the terminology of slavery by proposing „asymmetrical dependency“ as a new key concept encompassing all forms of bondage across time and space.

Our Master's program

Our Master's program is a one-year, research-oriented degree program offering you a broad perspective on interdisciplinary research on slavery and slavery-like phenomena through time and space.

The basic module (1) provides a sound knowledge of relevant historical phenomena as well as of the methodological and theoretical tools to pursue your own study and research interests.

Specialize in Slavery Studies

In accordance with the interdisciplinary perspective and innovative character of our program, the study program includes classes on transcultural comparison and current research debates (2 & 3).

Develop your individual research profile

Compulsory Elective Modules provide the room to follow your own interests and to explore textual sources, material culture, and empirical data.

The 4th module is dedicated to preparing your Master's thesis.
